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Who Created It?

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AN IMPORTANT NOTE TO ADULTS (Please read this.)

Parents, grandparents, Sunday school teachers, and educators,

Welcome to the new Beginner Inductive Bible Study series—inductive Bible studies that help young children learn how to read and study the Bible for themselves. This new series will help children develop important skills related to colors, shapes, positional concepts, reading, mathematics readiness, and dexterity as they learn God's Word.

Begin each day's study by reading the brief opening story aloud to the child. Put your finger under each word so the child will learn that words have meaning and are read from left to right. If the child has already learned how to read, let the child read the story aloud to you.

- When you come to the instructions, read them aloud to the child.
- When you see a verse of Scripture enclosed in a box, read the verse aloud one word at a time as the child repeats each word. Have the child touch each word while saying it out loud. This will teach the child to recognize words and to read from left to right.
- When you come to a question, ask the question out loud, and give the child time to think and then answer. Ask the 5 W's and an H questions: WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY, and HOW. This will help kids uncover what the Bible says and develop their thinking and reasoning skills.

Activities like tracing a word, drawing or coloring a key word, coloring pictures, and so on will help children develop fine motor skills, which are essential for writing readiness. Make sure the child has a pencil for writing, crayons to color the pictures of the days of creation, and colored pencils for marking Scripture. When the child draws or colors a

picture, ask them to tell you about what they have drawn or colored. Having them tell you from memory what they have learned develops their thinking, reasoning, and language skills.

As children follow directions, identify shapes and colors, and work with numbers, they develop their cognitive skills. As they answer questions and verbalize what they observe, they develop language skills.

Do not rush through this precious time with the child. Ask God to lead and guide you. Remember, you are giving this child incredible gifts: learning who God is, learning how to read and understand His Word, and spending time with you—one person God is using in their young life to love them, nurture them, and help them to grow and develop. May God bless and use you!


"Kate can do funny things. She loves to sniff out clues and lick our faces.


"Kate wants to help us learn about God. Do you know **WHO** God is?

"God uses the Bible to teach us. The Bible shows us **WHO** God is, **WHAT** He does, and **HOW** we can know Him and do what is right."




WEEK 1

In the Beginning

Genesis 1:1

The Bible is divided into two parts. The first part is called the Old Testament,

The first book in the Bible is the book of Genesis.


Let's look at the first verse in Genesis and say it out loud.

WHAT Is the First Book in the Bible?


Look at Kate. She has her head on Cooper's leg.

Trace the name of the first book of the Bible.




Now look at it. Touch it. Say it out loud.

Trace the name of the person who created the heavens and the earth.
